The Stone Church 2nd Avenue East location (around 1926 to 1951)

Owen Sound Pentecostal Tabernacle 9th Street East location (1952 to 1973)



In the early fall of 1917, Rev. John Ball was directed of the Lord to come to Owen Sound to open a work here. House prayer meetings were held for a short time, after which a Hall, seating about 75 people was rented on 10th Street East. The preaching of the Word of God was accompanied with signs following. Sinners were saved, backsliders were restored and believers received the infilling of the Holy Spirit. Rapid growth necessitated moving to another Hall on 9th Street, about where Todd's Sport Shop is now located. Services here commenced on November 18th, 1917, with even greater interest. On May 19, 1918, the first service was held in the new location in Lemon's Hall on 2nd Ave. East. This Hall seated about 900 people and on June 9th, the large Hall was crowded.

The first water baptismal service was held in the Bay on June 2, 1918, when 30 people identified themselves with the burial and resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ. Hundreds of spectators were present and two weeks later, another baptismal service was held. In the summer of 1926, Lemons Hall was vacated and meetings were held in a tent on 2nd Ave. East. While meetings were held here, the new Stone Church across the street was being built.

Important evangelistic efforts contributing to the growth of the church were the camp meetings on the Bayshore in 1932 and the tent meetings held in Brooke in 1933. In 1951, a forward step of faith was taken when a lot at the corner of 9th Street and 4th Ave. East was purchased. Subsequently, the Stone Church on 2nd Ave. East was sold. Willing hands worked long hours and progress on the new building was amazing. In April 1952, the new Pentecostal Church in Owen Sound was officially opened to the glory of God and this building served the congregation well for over 20 years.

In the early 1970's, a vision for future growth and more adequate facilities inspired the congregation to take another step forward in faith. Land was purchased on 4th Ave. West which became the sight of our present church, known as Rockcliffe Gospel Temple. The main building was completed and dedicated to the Lord in December of 1973. The Christian Education Wing was added and dedicated in October 1975.

One Hundred years have become history since the first official meeting of this congregation. It would take many books to record all the people and the events which God used over the years to bring us to this present moment. Many of our sons and daughters have

travelled across this nation and some around the world proclaiming this Pentecostal message. Others have been called to become part of what God is doing here at home.

As we look to the future, we anticipate the continued blessing of God to us and through us. As we love our Saviour in obedience to him, let us love each other and our community with the love of the Father. "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind. This is the first and greatest commandment. And the second is like it: Love your neighbor as yourself." Matthew 22:37 - 39.
